- All programs, both new & renewal cleared the minimum point thresholds necessary to be ELIGIBLE to go in the application to HUD.
- The lowest scoring program, which was requesting over \$500,000 in funding for new Shelter Plus Care certificates, was the only program it was necessary to alter in order to make up the \$273,000 funding deficit.
- Therefore, the 2009 CoC application will be able to include ALL programs that were scored today, but only after reducing the dollar amount of Talbert House's new Shelter Plus Care program from \$509,000 to \$236,000.
